

possible to our State Championships and join our Association.


Acouple of great results out of these Pennant finals were:

Around the Associations

Mid North Coast with Danny Knight

Hello all. Spring has certainly reached the Mid North Coast and most guys by now are well into their renovation programs. After what was a dry winter the rain arrived in September and has been quite reliable since. We would love to be able to send some to our brothers out west.

There have been a few reports of Spring Dead Patch and ERI following on from our prolonged hot conditions running into autumn. The pearl are still around but are from most reports having less of an impact due to improved practices in treatment and turf nutrition and general awareness.

I was in the fortunate position this year to be able to remove the surface from my old top green and replant. No one knows when it was done last, if ever, so it was well overdue.

Plugs taken prior showed around 40mm of thatch material which had built up noticeably after the three years the green couldn't be renovated following the flood in 2009.

I decided to take 50mm off which saw the turf cutter at full depth. It was a cleansing feeling knowing that day I was saying goodbye to many of my problems.

We removed the surface with a small posi track as access was limited and the machine loaded into small tippers which dumped the old turf as fill locally. This job took all day but the operator did a really great job of sticking to the cut line and not digging into the surface.

I had two weeks before I could get the grass to replant but I couldn't stand looking at the old surface anymore and needed it gone!

There were a few things I wanted to do while the top was off such as applying lime and gypsum, Merit and Meridian and some fungicide.

Mick Woods brought his Procore down from Tamworth and he went over the green with 19mm hollow tynes. I scarified the green after to fluff up the soil prior to laser levelling.

Alastair McArthur lasered the green on the Saturday prior to planting and corrected some areas we knew were out. We were very happy to get that job done as around 300mm had fallen in our area in the week leading up.

The final lead up job was to find a trailer to tow to South West Rocks to pick up the material to plant. I finally found an enclosed trailer from Kennards Hire similar to a horse float with a drop down ramp which worked really well.

I went down on the Monday morning to see Mark operating his Winston Suttle shaver he had rebuilt over the winter. He was more than impressed at the shute Phil Hartfield had custom designed which didn't clog like the factory model.

I helped Nathan push and barrow the shavings into the trailer and unloaded back at Urunga for planting the next morning.

Not knowing how many helpers I had turning up I decided I would barrow the material on and spread it by shovel as in a top dress (thank you Simon Cooper for that advice). We raked the green first with some customised pool fencing and then started spreading. I ended up putting on 5 bays at 5 barrows a bay and it went on really evenly. We rolled it in and put the mats down and were done by 9am and watering.

The strike one week on is great and I've started giving it light feeds and I'm looking forward to getting a mower on there.

Mark was delighted with the job his shaver did on his middle green. He followed that up with the scarifier, then the fat boy and then a cut and was confident he had removed most of the thatch. Nathan was pleased that Mark was pleased as he'd seen enough of the wheel barrow!

Craig Hayfield at Kempsey RSL has also been busy. Mark was being over-protective of his revamped shaver so Craig got the scarifier out instead. He then drilled using the clubs old machine. Craig has offered to any club interested in an old drilling machine- they can pick it up at their leisure from the bottom of the Macleay River. We warned him that if either Dave Croad or Dave Waters get their illegal trawler nets snagged on the drilling machine they would be furious!

Northern Rivers with Duncan Elphick

South Lismore Bowling Club up here on the Northern Rivers was the scene for our annual charity bowls day. A heavy sky and a cool breeze didn't dampen the mood of the 128 bowlers from across Zone 1, helping raise \$2,000 for "Our Kids", a local charity who maintain the facility set up to support those kids and families who are doing it tough from our local area.

Northern Rivers Greenkeepers have raised \$15,800 over the past 8 years alone, a great concept adopted many years before that. All these funds have been passed onto worthy charitable organisations in our local area. A proud tradition and one we hope will be around forever. Newly elected President of Northern Rivers Greenkeepers Association John Sheean hosted the day on our behalf and handed the club back over to the patrons at days end with full tills and empty kegs. Many thanks Patty for organising the day, and South Lismore Bowling Club for hosting us.

As mentioned we have a new leader at the helm in these parts. John Sheehan from Lismore City was appointed unopposed as President, yours truly as Secretary and Pat Nichols holds the purse strings as Treasurer.

Around the grounds, at Ballina RSL we Wintered well. There is some slight scaring from ERI type infections that were active last autumn in Air Force and Army Greens but the disease activity was minor, therefore severity of the scaring is considerably less than last spring. I can't say why this is so, but a programme based around plant health and root development is ongoing. Air2g2 aeration was carried out in late September and renovation procedures will be relatively minor but there will be soil applied to each surface for the first time in three seasons provided a decent soil type can be sourced.

Evans Head Greenkeeper Dave Turner reports his club will be running with the Water Park again this holiday season, which brings in the challenging scenario of planning a renovation around tournaments and holiday trade with only one green available for play at a three green club. Dave and his staff really do deserve high praise for the quality of the surface achieved over the winter months since last they had the structures on the green, considering the green is subjected to some pretty unreal extremes, I tip my hat guys.

Dave's set a very proactive disease control programme based around a variety of products to help with disease resistance and the results are evident for all to see.
