

If you are interested in coming, or you would like to put your entry in please give me a call (0404 812 748). Single entries will be found a pairs partner if you don't have one.



## Vale Lyle Houlahan



#### Danny Knight, President of the Mid North Coast Greenkeepers Association, shares memories of Life Member, Lyle Houlahan.

On the 18th of January we lost Life Member and longtime Sawtell greenkeeper Lyle Houlahan. Those who knew Lyle knew that greenkeeping was his life.

Growing up on a farm in Upper Orara, he was very much a country boy. Lyle's greenkeeping life began at Coffs Harbour Bowling Club as an apprentice to Ray Ellrig. Not long after starting there Lyle lost his father. His Uncle Tom, who was already close, took on the father figure role. Whenever Lyle wasn't working on the greens, he would be out helping Uncle Tom on the farm. If not there, you would find Lyle volunteering on the restoration of the old Dorrigo to Glenreagh railway line which would become a lifelong passion.

On the completion of his training at Coffs, Lyle's work ethic and enthusiasm earned him the greenkeeping role at Sawtell Bowling Club. His skills quickly won over the bowlers there. This began a tenure that would last 37 years and see him through to retirement.

Probably Lyle's greatest legacy was his ability to instill his love for the trade and work ethic into his apprentices. Lyle's apprentices generally went on to create their own status in the trade. These include Brett Long, Chris Hadgood, Craig Griffiths, Gordon Kilby and Brad Sim.

Lyle would never marry, nor have children. While his first love was greenkeeping, his other enjoyments were travelling and music. In vehicles and sound systems he had the best of the best. He loved nothing more than turning the key in his fully decked out Land Cruiser and going.

His interest in Australian exploration would see him venture to roads such as the Oodnadata Track, Strezleckie Track or Gunbarrell Highway. On the way there and back he would take time to visit as many greenkeepers as possible. He had mates everywhere. God help them if they asked about his car or music system, that often cost hours.

Toward the end of his career, Lyle was awarded Life Membership by the NSW Bowling Greenkeepers, thoroughly deserved and humbly received.

Lyle's funeral was a gathering of past and present greenkeepers from the area. Brett Long, now at Bribie Island Queensland, and wife Kim made the overnight trek. Brett's wish was to have a stubby of Old in the carpark with the colleague's in memory of his old boss, an effort driven from the respect he had for Lyle.

Lyle's legacy for the trade has now been carried by many fine tradesman. On behalf of the Mid North Coast boys Lyle will forever be remembered and Pictured: Greenkeepers and mates remember good respected. He was 71 years old.

# **Around the Associations Mid North Coast Report by Danny Knight**

Wow! It only felt like yesterday we were winding up a successful State Carnival at South West Rocks and it will soon be on again. Plans are well underway for the 2016 event in May and we can't wait! All of those I have spoken to loved it and will be backing up and if we can get a few more new faces there all the better.

By the time of print most of our colleagues will have completed their renovation programs and have their greens back in play in readiness for the pennant season. We have had a really good summer growth period with only a few weeks of extreme weather. Unusually we missed most of the heavy rain events that caused havoc in many other parts of the state. Our thoughts go out to those who copped the harsh conditions as most of us have been through similar circumstances in recent years.

I recently caught up with Dave Wills who was the greenkeeper at the Coffs Catholic Club (Club Coffs) when it was forced to shut its doors in an unfortunate fashion last year. As I have mentioned previously, Dave had worked at the club for well over 30 years and gave his heart and soul to the club. After a long anxious wait the staff finally received a payout through a government fund set up for such events.

Unfortunately this lump sum came with a hefty tax bill and also cut any entitlements that Dave's family was receiving. Dave has been doing some part time cleaning work to get by but it is not the way he deserved to finish his career. Our thoughts go out again.

On a brighter note, we had good numbers turn up for our Christmas party to end the year with a festive occasion. Held at the South West Rocks Surf Club, the view, food and atmosphere were amazing. This also doubled as our send off to retiree Ken Martin and as a thank you to his contribution to our association over many years. Thanks to President Mark Wilcher for organising a wonderful night.

Speaking of Mark, he discovered a novel way of getting some time off over the peak period. In a bit of a rush, as happens this time of year, Mark was taking the roller off the green. In doing so he managed to crush his thumb between the roller handle and an adjacent steel post. Splitting the skin and breaking the bone, Mark was ordered by the doctor to swap the Scott Bonnar for the Samsung remote.

#### **Ground Pearl Update**

The follow up on my report on Ground Pearl has been positive and promising. Since writing the report we learned of the significance of the adult male in the breeding cycle. Mark Wilcher (South West Rocks) found an article in an old chemturf book which referred to the male as a small gnat like creature. His purpose is to hover on the surface and impregnate the pink adult female as she reaches the surface. She then goes straight back down in the profile to find a safe place to lay her eggs. The male is not thought to be damaging to the turf.

Although Mark and I have been using different products we have implemented a similar approach of having a range of insecticides in the profile at all times. Not long after we started our programs we began noticing adult females on the surface in the mornings. Some were dead, some looked sick and others looked perfectly healthy. They were obviously coming to the surface in the heat of the previous day but not wanting to go back down. As the summer has progressed we have witnessed decreasing numbers coming to the surface to the point

where it is almost impossible to find them. Although my patches are still visible, the plant in them is healthy and showing no signs of wilting on the hot days. After the first month (September) of treating the affected areas independently, I have gone back to treating the whole green as you would in a normal program.

We are lucky to have some really good, safe, new insecticides on the market as your local reps would have discussed. The use of wetting agents are important and we believe the use of an oil is crucial. I use Melaleuca oil, others believe white oil. Whichever you choose, the oil seems to create an uncomfortable environment for them. The other benefit of these new insecticides is keeping the surface free of other predators such as mites and coccids which further detract from plant health. They may be helping to remove the surface dwelling adult male, also detracting from the breeding cycle. It's hard to determine exactly what stage of their cycle is being affected in a normal work environment. The positive thing is their numbers are decreasing and the plant is healthy. I hope we have given you a ray of hope to develop your own program to limit the impact of these menacing critters.

Couch mite have been causing some havoc around the Northern Rivers. A hard target pest to reach and very particular methods used when trying to treat the microscopic pest have led to intensive use of miteacides and much frustration with control mostly ineffective long term. Symptoms of infestation are often long lasting and the sight of the swollen stolon and bunchytop are very common around these parts. Perennial pests such as Ground Pearl and mealy bug are also in large numbers and have been enjoying the living conditions we supply them with.

Not a lot of Disease activity around compared to other years. Hot and dry conditions at the end of Summer no doubt helping to limit a lot of the symptoms usually associated with Tiff in Autumn...Long may it last!

Keeping to the theme of previous reports of clubs trying to gain added revenue from their outside assets, Evans Head Bowlo have been very happy with the revenue generated by the fun park they created on the number one green.

That's right folks ... a fun/water park complete with inflatable water slides, jumping castles, outdoor furniture, big screens, portable decking and two shipping containers that have sat on the previously flawless bowling surface since 16<sup>th</sup> of December.



#### Frequently Asked Questions: Awards & Pay Rates

#### What can I do if my takehome pay is lower than the modern award?

You can't have your takehome pay reduced as a result of the commencement of the new Fair Work System. Modern awards commenced on 1 January 2010, along with the new National Employment Standards.

The commencement of these new entitlements is not intended to result in employees receiving a pay cut. If you believe your take-home pay has been cut, you can apply to Fair Work Australia to make a 'take home pay order'.

## What is a take-home pay order?

A take-home pay order can preserve your existing rates of pay while you remain in the same job. It can apply to wages and allowances, as well as incentive based payments and overtime. An order can apply to an individual or a class of employees or outworkers who are in a similar position.

# A take-home pay order can be made if:

- A modern award applies to the employee or employees, and
- The employee or employees are in the same job as they were before the modern award commenced, and
- The amount of the employees' take-home

- pay for working the same sort of hours or the same sort of work has been reduced, and
- This reduction in takehome pay has occurred because of the commencement of the modern award.

#### Who can apply for a takehome pay order?

You or your union can apply to Fair Work Australia for a take-home pay order. In addition, a person acting on your behalf or on behalf of a class of employees may apply.

An application for a takehome pay order can also be made by an organisation representing outworkers on behalf of those outworkers.
