

I would like to take this opportunity to offer our thoughts to any member who may have lost a loved one during the year.



Here we are, right in the middle of winter now, paint brush in hand, looking at those wet greens getting flogged and waiting for the westerly's in August to dry them back.

Straight from the silly comments fill, Mad Mark had one of his lovely lady bowlers come up to him on a Sunday morning and ask which direction play would be today, to which he replied north south, her informed response was "Oh good, the greens are quicker that way, which why is north south again?" no wonder we drink. Seriously!

Has anyone else out there got a government grant lately? I have been on the lucky end of a few grants over the years; some of them have been fairly easy to obtain others we have had to jump through hoops to get. The most important factor in any of them has been engaging the Local state or Federal Member of Parliament. Get them on board and the wheels tend to be greased a bit easier.

The most recent grant I have been involved in was this year. We gained a grant from the Community Development Grants, this is a direct grant from the local member to community based organisations to get stuff built. Things that come into it are resurfacing greens, erection of shades, lighting toilets and amenity blokes. This grant is on offer every year. We are using it to lay some pathways and erect shades around all greens.

The process for this grant is fairly simple, it's done all online and you need to engage the local state member, give them a brief outline of the benefits of the project for the greater community, more buttering of the state member, get together some well priced quotes and then finally offer the local state member a free meal and some well priced drinks or as we did the Patron of the club.

Unlike the Department of Sport and Rec grants, where you need to fund half the project yourself, you can use the money to fully fund your project.

It is worth the hassle of getting involved for these grants, they are going to give the money to someone. Why not get your club to check it out? They even have websites set up to make it easier to find them. The Federal Government site is grants.myregion.gov.au; you can go through this site to search available grants for NSW then there is the old Department of Sport and Rec grants that are open year from their website. All the best to the guys heading down to Championship Week in Port Macquarie. I'm sure it will be a fantastic week. Travel safe.


I would again like to wish a speedy recovery to those of us not doing so well. We hope you make a full recovery and can't wait to see you back on the greens.



At the time of writing this report, June 3, couch has well and truly gone into dormancy. Most greens have had quite a difficult time with some very wet weather over the past week. Greens are wet, plenty of wear and under terrible disease pressure. Along with these problems and Poa has started to germinate.

Monument is the obvious answer for Poa control. Always remember to add a non-ionic surfactant. This will give a 20% better efficacy of the chemical.

There are a number of other strategies to help in the management of greens during this difficult period. One strategy which may not have been used in the past is the application of a soil penetrant such as Dispatch, to help reduce pooling of surface water etc. in times of wet weather. Dispatch is a patented technology which maximises irrigation and water efficiency.

The other point worth mentioning is the closure of Turftec. Turftec was once a substantial supplier to the bowling green industry. This will create a substantial hole in the industry. The alternative to Turftec Rollers will be the Smooth Roll. All parts will be available from your local Globe representative.

Frequently Asked Questions: Awards & Pay Rates

What can I do if my take-home pay is lower than the modern award?

You can't have your take-home pay reduced as a result of the commencement of the new Fair Work System. Modern awards commenced on 1 January 2010, along with the new National Employment Standards. The commencement of these new entitlements is not intended to result in employees receiving a pay cut. If you believe your take-home pay has been cut, you can apply to Fair Work Australia to make a 'take home pay order'.

What is a take-home pay order?

A take-home pay order can preserve your existing rates of pay while you remain in the same job. It can apply to wages and allowances, as well as incentive based payments and overtime. An order can apply to an individual or a class of employees or outworkers who are in a similar position.

A take-home pay order can be made if:

A modern award applies to the employee or employees, and

The employee or employees are in the same job as they were before the modern award commenced, and

The amount of the employees' take-home pay for working the same sort of hours or the same sort of work has been reduced, and

I This reduction in take-home pay has occurred because of the commencement of the modern award.

Who can apply for a take-home pay order?

You or your union can apply to Fair Work Australia for a take-home pay order. In addition, a person acting on your behalf or on behalf of a class of employees may apply. An application for a take-home pay order can also be made by an organisation representing outworkers on behalf of those outworkers.
