


Finally I would like to thank all the other Executive members for their ongoing work and for giving up so much of their own time to continue the work of previous committees.

We had some very positive feedback from this year's speakers and with continued input from our members we can always try to source what you need.





AROUND THE ASSOCIATIONS

Mid North Coast Report by Danny Knight

As you know the Mid North Coast once again hosted the recent State Championship Week in early May. The weather had been awful in the lead up, however, the cloud disappeared and the sun shone throughout the course of the week. South West Rocks was the venue and host greenkeepers, Mark and Nathan, did an awesome job in presenting their venue. The boys must have felt chuffed seeing the finals played on a green that had only been regrassed in December. They even had to combat an "Apocalypse" of late season Black Beetles which paid an unwelcome visit early on Monday evening. The club itself was overjoyed with our patronage and is already making plans and fine tuning for next year.

We recently held a meeting on the banks of the Kalang River at Urunga. Our annual Carnival Day to be held at Scotts Head was discussed. Due to our initial date clashing with State Pennant playoffs we decided to move our day back two weeks to Tuesday August 18th. Dave Croad at Hat Head, Mark Wilcher from South West Rocks and Gary Witte, who plays at Macksville, have all won their way through to the State playoffs. Good luck to them all.

A couple of us recently attended a trade show at Bonville International Golf Club. Although golf aligned, it was interesting to talk to some of the Supers and chemical technicians about possible approaches to somehow control ground pearl. While there is no registered cure, the consensus was that whatever we are trying needs to be delivered deep into the profile. Our best chance is to treat the affected areas regularly throughout the year with the goal of somehow breaking their life cycle.

The effects of ERI were also discussed and it seems that building the root health over the spring period with Trichoderma is having positive results. We discussed both these issues at our meeting and their prevalence over the last 10 years being in pattern with the deregistered residual chemicals (the likes of Deildren, DDT etc) finally breaking down in the soil.

All attendees at the meeting are reporting varied forms of ERI. We spoke about taking more regular photos of outbreaks and comparing notes at upcoming meetings. It seems that all of the greens in our area are reporting varied forms of the disease.

On a sad note Club Coffs, previously the Coffs Harbour Catholic Club shut its doors for good in April. They had been under the watch of administrators for a number of years. The club has been home to well known greenkeepers including Barry Dray, Tommy Smith, Brett Long and its final custodian Dave Wills. Dave had been loyal to the club for over 30 years working under all of the above. He finally got his opportunity to take the reins when Brett moved to Bribie Island. Dave was doing a fantastic job hosting many high end events but slowly budget cuts led to staff cuts. The infrastructure was deteriorating which was all the time making Dave's job harder and less enjoyable. It was Dave's nature though to push ahead with the hope of brighter times ahead. Anyone who has ever met Dave would agree he deserved much better. On last report Dave was waiting for the dust to settle and was weighing up options. We all wish him well.

Frequently Asked Questions: Awards & Pay Rates

What can I do if my takehome pay is lower than the modern award?

You can't have your takehome pay reduced as a result of the commencement of the new Fair Work System. Modern awards commenced on 1 January 2010, along with the new National Employment Standards.

The commencement of these new entitlements is not intended to result in employees receiving a pay cut. If you believe your takehome pay has been cut, you can apply to Fair Work Australia to make a 'takehome pay order'.

What is a take-home pay order?

A take-home pay order can preserve your existing rates of pay while you remain in the same job. It can apply to wages and allowances, as well as incentive based payments and overtime. An order can apply to an individual or a class of employees or outworkers who are in a similar position.

A take-home pay order can be made if:

- A modern award applies to the employee or employees, and
- The employee or employees are in the same job as they were before the modern award commenced, and
- The amount of the employees' take-home

- pay for working the same sort of hours or the same sort of work has been reduced, and
- This reduction in takehome pay has occurred because of the commencement of the modern award.

Who can apply for a takehome pay order?

You or your union can apply to Fair Work Australia for a take-home pay order. In addition, a person acting on your behalf or on behalf of a class of employees may apply.

An application for a takehome pay order can also be made by an organisation representing outworkers on behalf of those outworkers.
